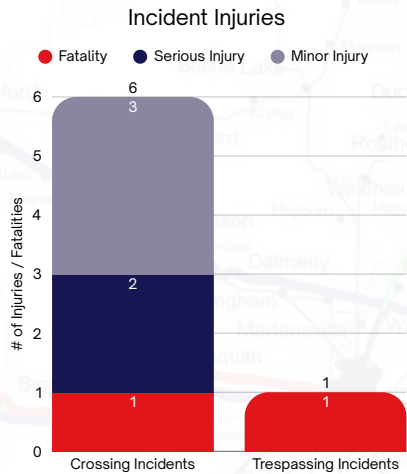

78% of Saskatchewan incidents this year have resulted in injury or fatality.



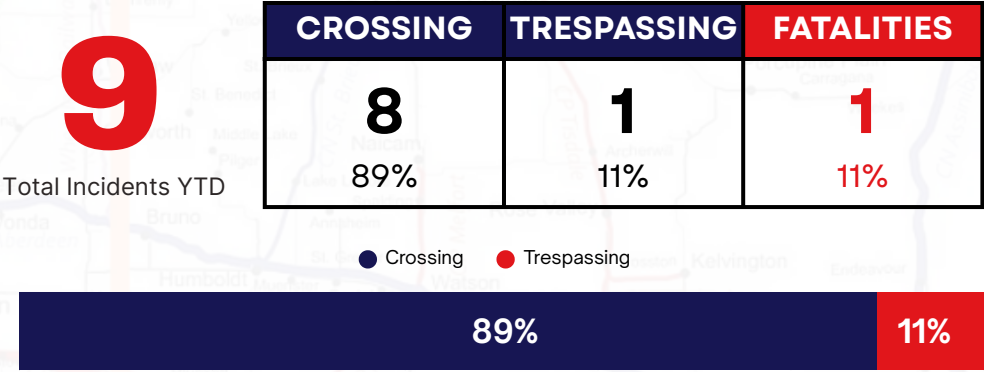
Looking Back:
How Railways
Helped Build

July marks an important milestone in Saskatchewan's railway history. In July 1906, the Qu'Appelle, Long Lake and Saskatchewan Railroad and Steamboat Company became part of the Canadian Northern Railway, helping create stronger rail connections across the province.

Railways played a vital role in building Saskatchewan, connecting communities, supporting agriculture, and opening new opportunities for trade and settlement.

Data from Jan 1 - June 30, 2026

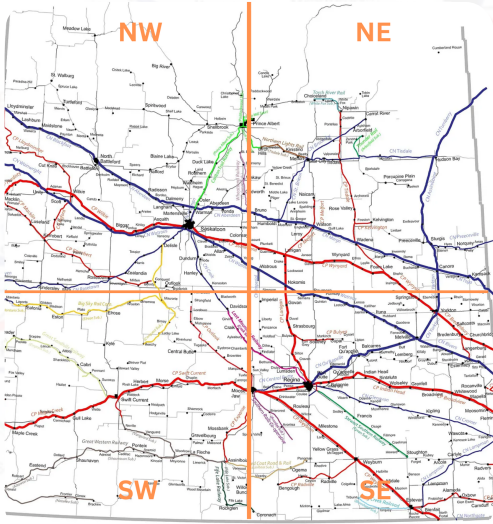
TOTAL INCIDENTS
